PHIL'S GANNET - THIS IS WHAT ABBA IS ALL ABOUT

The Toolbox visit on Saturday 7th May was to ABBA member Phil Cook's project. Phil is building a 4.5m Iain Oughtred designed 'Gannet' sailing dinghy. As a teenager, Phil used to sail Lasers on the Lane Cove River in Sydney and has not sailed since then. But he has wanted to build a boat for years and bought plans for the Gannet about six years ago. However, it wasn't until January 2015 that he decided to start building in his car port at home, not an ideal workshop he says. This is the first boat he has owned or built, and he's been a member of the ABBA for about a year since starting work on the project.



lain Oughtred's website describes the Gannet as the medium sized design in the range he calls his 'Planing or Elegant Tinny' range. Gannet, like her smaller sister, Shearwater, and larger sister Fulmar has a flat planing body and wide transom, ideal for planing under sail in ideal conditions and planing under power with modest outboards and a load.



The vital statistics of the Gannet are;

The plans for all Iain Oughtred's designs are available in Australia through Oughtred Boats at their website www.oughtredboats.com and plans for the Gannet are currently priced at \$238. These plans give the builder a good level of detail, show several deck layout options and alternative rigs – lugsail, marconi or gaff/gunter.

Phil's Gannet project is well advanced and has reached the final fit out and internal finishing stage with launch not that far away. His woodwork is of a high standard and has resulted in a very nice looking example of a very pretty design.

The hull is lapstrake construction from 6mm Okoume plywood supplied by Aaron Woodall and the centre case, thwarts and other structural timber components, as well as the solid wood transom, are Victorian Ash (also known as Aussie Oak) from Austim in Landsdale. Phil has added Banksia trim to the top of the centre case for effect. West System epoxy from Fibreglass & Resin Sales in Welshpool has been used throughout the project. The exterior of the hull has already been painted with a single pack polyurethane from Boat Paints in Fremantle and Phil will be using a marine varnish finish for much of the hull interior. So it's great to see members supporting those businesses that have been good to ABBA over many years – well done on your buying approach Phil!



Phil is intending to adopt the gunter rig and the pictures show his mast, gaff and boom already constructed from oregan sourced from Auswest in Osborne Park. He has his sails on order from North Sails and where appropriate is using bronze fittings on the mast and hull. His masthead fitting and a rudder pintal were available for our inspection at the Toolbox. These fittings are of a very high quality and finish supplied by Davey UK via Classic Boat Supplies in Australia (see www.classic-boat-supplies.com.au).



So all that remains to do is to finish the few remaining components and source a trailer before launching can be planned. Sounds pretty straight forward but Phil is not in a hurry. He hasn't planned a date at this stage except to say that his proximity to the river will facilitate a planned pre launch wetting to ensure he is happy with final product before the official launch.

All members who attended this Toolbox afternoon were impressed with the quality of Phil's project. We thank Phil for taking time out from making more shavings and look forward to the big day.

April Technical Meeting

The technical meeting on Wednesday 6th April was a presentation of the first half (45 mins) of a video "Two Men in a Punt – In the wake of the Huon Piners". It is difficult to recount the content of the video in this newsletter but the background and summary transcribed from the DVD cover below will give some signal of the story line to those unable to attend that ABBA event.

"A special tree, the Huon pine, grows in the wet temperate rainforests of Western Tasmania. Slow growing, some trees have been dated at over three thousand years old. Fine grained, stable, and containing a special oil which inhibits rot, it was quickly recognised by the pioneers as ideal for boat building and a host of other uses.

'Two Men in a Punt' follows in the wake of the piners. Ron Morrison, himself a descendent of a prominent pining family, was involved in the closing era of pining. We join Ron and his friend, Franz, as they re-trace a journey up the Gordon river and its tributaries re-discovering the remains of old camps-sites and logging operations.

Their adventures are interspersed and enriched by unique interviews with old piners, recorded in 2003, whose experiences date back to the 1930's when everything was done by horse and by hand."

In the video, Ron Morrison and Franz follow the trails of the old Huon pine loggers in the Tasmanian forest east of Strahan. It's a gentle documentary, un-staged and lots of friendly banter, with cuts to the interesting interviews with the various old piners. There is a strong connection to Tassie boat building through the Huon pine subject matter, and there's a reasonable smattering of pictures/films/discussions on boats. But the main focus is the relationship between Ron and Franz, which is entertaining, and the wilderness through which they were travelling, which is stunning.

JUNE TECHNICAL MEETING

Our next tech meeting will be on Wednesday 1st June, as usual in the Heritage Room at South of Perth Yacht Club, 7.30pm for an 8pm start.

Our presenter for this technical meeting is Gary Martin, owner and manager of Boat Paints in South Fremantle, who has kindly agreed to present on his classic yacht Acrospire IV. Members may recall Gary presented a talk on boat paints and painting at the ABBA technical meeting exactly one year ago, during which there was a bit of friendly banter between him and Ralph Newton over their respective classic yachts, Acrospire IV and Eun Mara (we visited Eun Mara around that time during her refit at Maylands Boatyard). ABBA thought it only fair that Gary be offered the opportunity to tell us about Acrospire IV. She was designed and built in St Kilda in 1929 by Charles Peel, and is a half scale of the famous J boat America's Cup yachts. She rates as an International 9 metre (the forerunner to the 12 metre Americas Cup yachts), is 54 ft long and weighs 13 tonnes. She was brought to WA from Victoria in about 1970 by B. Moss and spent much of her time at South of Perth Yacht Club before Gary bought her in 2007. Gary had known her for 20 years and worked on her for 10 years prior to buying her. He has carried out a major restoration of the yacht and now sails and races her regularly. Gary will be showing pictures and talking about the restoration as well as showing pictures of her on the water around Fremantle.

JULY TOOLBOX VISIT

Our Saturday 2nd July, the Toolbox Visit will be held at the home of Brent Ireland, who is building a Farrier F32R folding, trailerable trimaran. This is a larger version of Harry Speight's F82A, the construction of which long standing ABBA members will recall from previous technical and toolbox meetings. At Harry's request, Brent presented his project at ABBA's Toolbox meeting on Saturday 18th June 2011, and he has kindly agreed to host our next Toolbox Visit. The Farrier F32R is 32 ft long, and the R stands for Racing, which Farrier reserves for foam built boats (Harry's boat is designated A for Amateur(!) since it is strip planked). Brent's project is now at the fitting out and joining up stage, with main hull, floats and beams ready for assembly. Brent's address is 1 Lexcen Crescent, Ocean Reef and visit time is between 2 and 4pm.
